## Science Festival 2024/2025

Every year more and more students apply and participate successfully in the 17<sup>th</sup> Science Festival. This year we had **48 students and 26 projects** performed on 14<sup>th</sup> January. The presentations have been recorded, and they will be reachable for our science teachers in the SharePoint. In the following week, we had an entire week when all the Science/Physics/Biology/Chemistry teachers had the opportunity to watch the projects, whom decided to take part on the Audience Award competition. The students vote for their favorite video.

We had approximately **1000 students** in the audience in the whole day, they have seen 4 projects on stage. In the online week an average lesson they could see 3-4 videos. We received the total of **1242 votes.** We can confidently say, that we reached at least half of the students in the secondary section.

The jury panel (from different languages sections and scientific field and one APEEE member) spent 8 hours watching the presentations, scored them and its abstracts, and finally they announced the winners of the competition in the Senior and the Junior categories. Since the same amount of points received, the Senior first and second place were tied, so two winners were announced.
